

Rainbow Sun

(English UK terms)

Materials:

Yarn:

- Approx. 5 gram solid coloured 8/4 cotton yarn for the head.
- Approx. 7 gram colour changing 8/4 cotton yarn for the rays.
- Small piece of black cotton yarn to embroider eyes and mouth with (approx 35cm)

For the sun in this pattern I used Scheepjes Sunkissed 018 and Rainbow Cotton 8/4 Print 04.

Hook: 2.5 mm.

1 marker Filling Tapestry needle Scissors

Size and shape:

The Rainbow Sun is crocheted in a spiral from the front to the back, and the whole sun is crocheted in one piece. If you use 8/4 (fingering) cotton yarn and crochet hook 2.5 mm, the sun will measure about 8.5cm in diameter including the curly rays.

Gauge:

Gauge is important to keep in mind so that the filling does not come through or is visible between the stitches. Use a crochet hook that fits your yarn.

Color distribution:

You use the solid coloured yarn for the face and back, and the colour changing yarn for the curly rays. How you change colour is described in the pattern.

Abbreviations, **UK** terms:

St - stitch

 $\mathbf{Ch} - \mathbf{ch}$

Ss − slip stitch

Dc – double crochet

Dec – decrease: crochet 2 dc together in next two stitches. Invisible decrease is described below.

Inc – increase: crochet 2 dc in next stitch.

Flo – front loop only

Blo – back loop only

Yo – yarn over



Invisible decrease:

The invisible decrease gives an extra smooth finish to your work.

Insert your hook into the next two stitches **front loop only**, yo and pull through the stitches, yo and pull through both loops on the hook.



Pattern notes:

- This pattern is crocheted in a spiral. Use a marker to mark the first stitch in each round.
- Stitches between () are repeated as many times as indicated after the parentheses.
- Stitches between | | shows how many stitches you should have after completing the round.

Pattern:

Read the pattern notes before you start.

Tip: Place a marker in the first dc in each round to mark the beginning of the round.

Round 1:

With solid coloured yarn into a magic ring:

ch1 (does not count as a stitch), 8dc.

[8 dc]



Round 2: Inc x 8. |16 dc|



Round 3: (Inc, 1dc) x 8. |24 dc|

Round 4: (Inc, 2dc) x 8. |32 dc|

Round 5-6: 32dc. |32 dc|

- Remove the hook and place the marker in the loop. Do **not** cut the yarn.
- Weave in the end from the beginning magic ring.

Crochet the curly rays:

Note: All ss in this round are crocheted front loop only (flo) so that we can continue to work the backside in the back loops later.

Attach the colour changing yarn **flo** in any dc in **round 6**,

ch10, turn and crochet back, 2dc in the second ch from the hook, 2dc in next 8 ch, ss **flo** in next dc in round 6,

(ss **flo** in next dc in **round 6**, ch10, turn and crochet back, 2dc in the second ch from the hook, 2dc in next 8 ch, ss **flo** in next dc in **round 6**) x 15, ss **flo** in the dc where you started the round, cut yarn and weave in the two ends.

|16 curly rays|





Embroider eyes and mouth with a piece of black yarn, approx 35cm is enough.



Round 7:

Note: All dc in this round are crocheted back loop only (blo) into dc in round 6.

Remove the marker and continue to crochet with the solid coloured yarn,

32dc **blo**. |32 dc|



Round 8: 32dc. |32 dc|

Round 9: (Dec, 2dc) x 8. |24 dc|

Round 10: (Dec, 1dc) x 8. |16 dc|

Round 11: Dec x 8, cut yarn and leave a long tail for sewing. |8 dc|



Stuff the sun with filling. You can use the back of your crochet hook to poke it in place.

Sew the hole together with a tapestry needle by threading the yarn in the front loop in the 8 last stitches and then tighten and fasten the thread.
